Model Aeronautical Association of Queensland Annual General Meeting – 6 September 2022 President's Report

Dear Club Representatives and Members,

Tonight's annual general meeting represents the end of my tenure as President of the Model Aeronautical Association of Queensland. I have been very honoured to serve as your president and I am very happy with the progress and achievements off the last couple of years. I think the outgoing committee leave the association in good shape for the next committee to continue to build upon and make improvements. Of course, I am not abandoning aeromodelling and I continue to contribute to the best of my abilities as MAAA Vice President and president of my local club.

My tenure as President has coincided with dramatic changes in the world due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This greatly impacted upon many of our clubs and their ability to run events or even continue their regular flying. Although I note that we were much more fortunate than some of our southern brethren.

Likewise, the last 12 months has seen the persistence of the la Nina weather pattern with many of our clubs being impacted by unseasonal rain and flooding. This has likewise seen cancellation of many events and damage to many clubs. I note that my own club suffered greatly due to flooding of the Logan river and it will take us many more months if not years to fully recover.

With adversity also comes opportunity. Upon becoming President it was apparent that the MAAQ could better embrace technology to serve its members. Likewise, we undertook a review of the structure of the MAAQ committee to determine how to best serve how members.

We no longer meet on weekends taking up valuable "flying time". We no longer expect physical attendance at meetings or effectively require attendees to reside within the South East of the state. Participation in our meetings and administration has greatly benefited from embracing technology including video-conferencing – we now regularly have attendance and representation from clubs as far as way as Cairns, Townsville, Mackay, Innisfail, Roma, Kingaroy and more. And the MAAQ has greatly benefited from the broader representation and input of these members – we do after all have around 65 clubs spread across the State.

The MAAQ has also embraced a revised committee structure. The Committee is now more aligned with the priorities of the organisation – supporting clubs to run events and grow their membership, representing our members to regulators and other stakeholders, meeting our statutory requirements and securing our airspace. This has also resulted in a much reduce spend on honorariums freeing up valuable funds to support clubs and events.

The restructure included the appointment of the MAAQ CFI – this allowed the committee to ensure that the most appropriate person was appointed to undertake a critical role. I commend Steve for his commitment to the role and the great job he has done. We've received much great feedback regarding Steve's efforts. Likewise, in the North, Steve has been ably assisted by Grant as the assistant CFI. I believe that the number of instructors that have been re-accredited exceeds any other state in Australia.

Other initiatives and achievements of the MAAQ over the last couple of years have included:

- Refresh of the MAAQ website. This now includes an event page that allows clubs to list their events on the MAAQ calendar as a central reference point. We have over 138 events posted to the website calendar since it was implemented in 2021. Many of these were linked to facebook events.
- 2. Club Portal. The website also incorporates a portal to allow clubs to update their contact details and committee to ensure that emails contacts details are always up to date. 60 of our clubs have logged in to self-manage their club details and renewal with MAAQ online.
- 3. Grants. With the savings on honorariums we set up and documented a clear criteria for grants to clubs and special interest groups. The criteria is included in the MAAQ By-laws and primarily focuses on growth of clubs, participation, membership. There is also support for clubs running events that promote activity and camaraderie amongst out members.
- 4. Supporting and advocating for clubs to receive assistance from the MAAA Club Assistance Scheme. This year was the biggest round of funding to go to Queensland clubs for many years. This was also supported with financial assistance for each of these clubs from the MAAQ.
- 5. MAAQ Gazebos. We purchased 6 shade structures to be distributed throughout the state to assist clubs running events. The feedback on the gazebos has been fantastic please keep in mind that they are available for all clubs to use.
- 6. Brisbane Airshow. Once again, we participated in the Brisbane Airshow to present aeromodelling to the public. This was a great opportunity to put aeromodelling in front of the public and within an aviation context. We handed out around 200 pamphlets, 150 MAAA chuck gliders and the two flight simulators were a hit all weekend. I would like to thank and congratulate Mick Dallmann, George Atkinson, and Jason Reid for ensuring the success of this undertaking.

The last couple of years has not been without its challenges (other than COVID-19 and rain). I think it is somewhat inevitable that we must accept that aeromodelling is not the "cool" hobby that we all want it to be – especially when it comes to juniors. We must be realistic about our likely next generation of members and focus our finite resources

accordingly. Membership numbers unfortunately continue to show a slight downwards trend. But this is consistent with national and international experiences.

We also face a challenging and constantly changing regulatory environment. As an example, only last week CASA put additional restrictions on the MAAA's FPV exemption document limiting FPV operations to MAAA registered fields.

Many of our clubs continue to face pressure to secure tenure at their flying sites. Toowoomba, Sunshine Coast and Logan are all notable examples of club sites that may not exist in the next couple of years. This needs strong and determined leadership at the club level and support from the MAAQ. Conversely, reports of what the guys in Cairns and SAAMBR have achieved give us all hope.

The MAAQ has also had to deal with several instances of CASA mandated investigations into incidents at our flying fields. I think these matters have been handled very professionally and our priority has always been to protect the interests of all of our members.

I strongly urge all members to adopt a culture on honesty and compliance when confronted with accidents or incidents. It is much better to put ones hand up for a "mea culpa" then being found out to have concealed or conflated the facts.

The one point I would make about the MAAQ, MAAA and CASA is this. Whilst we are all separately managed and independent clubs, we are also all MAAA members. MAAA membership secures privileges and rights that may not otherwise be available to our individual members. Conversely, a failure by one of our members or clubs to follow the rules, or demonstrate a culture of compliance places us all at risk of further restrictions.

I would urge all of you to stay up to date with the CASA regulations, MAAA MOPS and other directives that are published from time to time. Encourage your members to do the same – CASA are becoming much more inclined to visit and audit clubs as they have done recently. The MAAA recently announced a clean-up of the MOPS and there will be some significant changes to ensure safety and clarity around our operations etc.

I would like to take this opportunity to pass on my thanks to all of those who have served with me on the MAAQ committee over the last couple of years. Graham Maynard, Warren Hathaway and Darryl Gunst each served with me in the early days of my time on the committee and I greatly valued their organisation knowledge and history. Whilst Darryl, Warren and I had some big disagreements at the time, with the benefit of hindsight, I hope they would each be appreciative of what I have tried to achieve.

To the members of the current committee – thank you. Greg has been as hardworking a secretary as you could ask for and he has never shirked taking on a task. Randall's attention to detail with the finances, timeliness of payments and reporting, and dedication to the MAAQ gives me immense comfort that the moneys are in very safe hands. Mick has effectively covered the development and PRO roles. He is a genuine aeromodeller at heart and will make a be a great next president of the MAAQ. And finally Craig has been

a great Vice President. Representing and helping our members in the North as well as being a trusted voice of reason.

I am confident that the MAAQ will continue to be well served by its incoming committee. As stated at the outset I will continue to be active with the MAAA and I look forward to working with the new committee to further and promote aeromodelling in Queensland and Australia.

Thank you for the privilege of being able to serve as MAAQ President.

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
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
